



Key National Benchmarks - Where Does Your Institution Stand?



Enrolled Student Credit Hours (SCH) by Days from Census - Percent Change




The percentage change of student credit hours between Spring 2021 enrollment compared to Spring 2022 enrollment over the period of 100 days prior to and throughout until the college's census day.






The percentage of first-time students from Fall 2020 completing gateway courses in English Comp I/II and Math by the end of Spring 2021 term.

Revenue and Expenses per FTE Student



Total revenues per FTE (full-time equivalent) student and Total Expenditures per FTE (full-time equivalent) student for Fiscal Year 2021.

Persistence Rate



The persistence rate is the percent of Fall 2020 credit students, both full- and part-time, who return to the campus for the next term (usually Spring 2021), or for the next Fall term (Fall 2021). This metric excludes students who graduated or completed certificates in the time frame.

Completer Success Rate



The percent of students who received grades of A, B, C, or Pass in their courses in Fall 2020.
