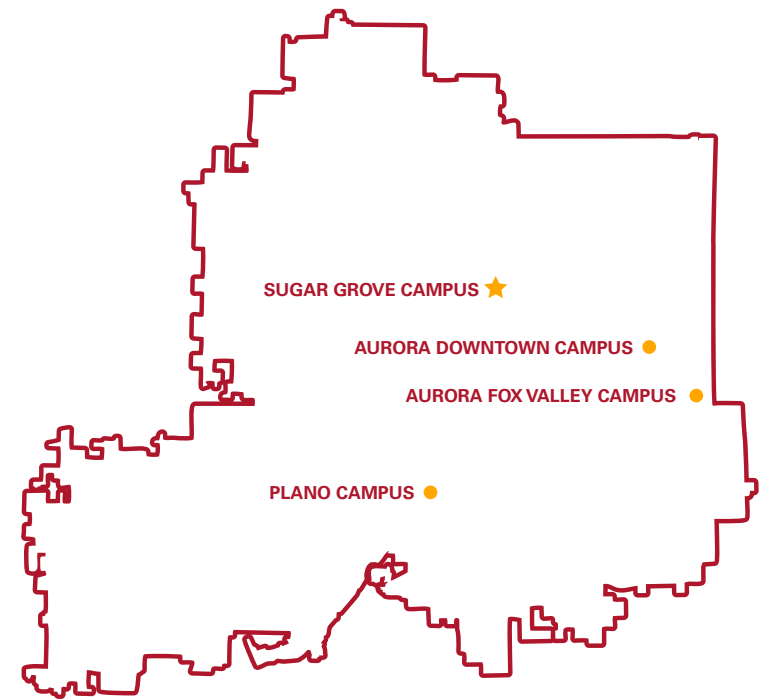

FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS

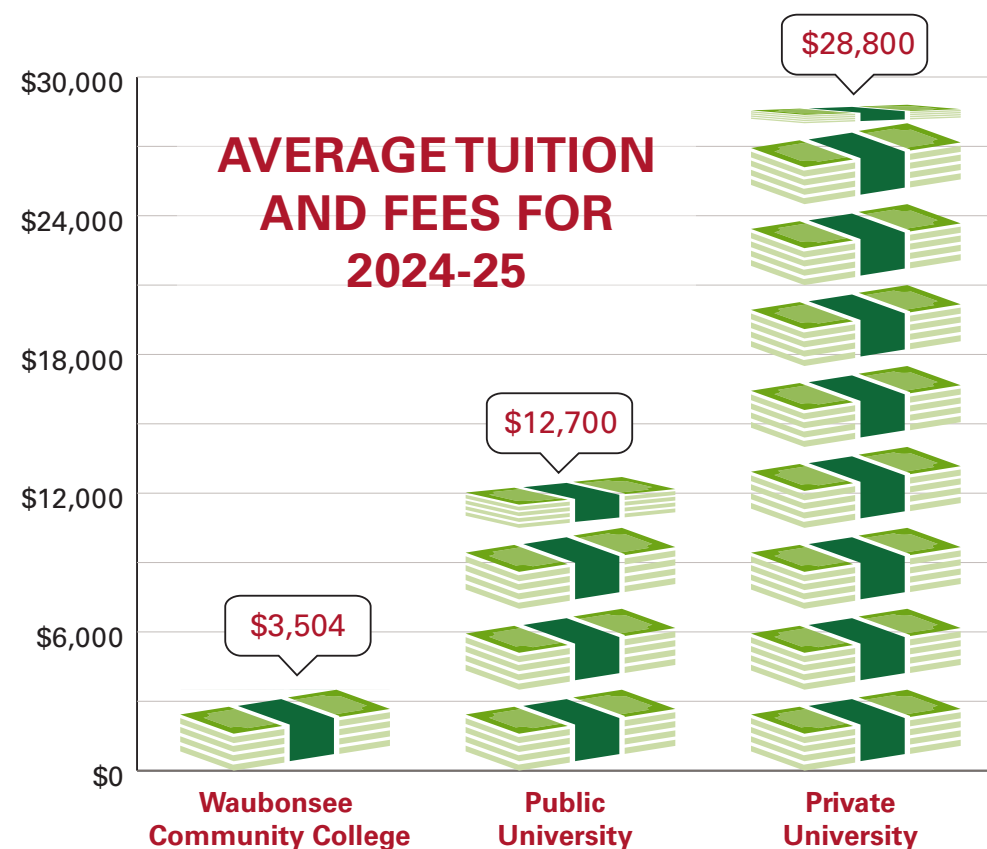
