## Kicking Around the Keystone State

**Tour Dates:** April 21<sup>st</sup> – April 26<sup>th</sup>, 2025

**DAY 1 Depart for Columbus:** Depart from Fox River Valley this morning at 7:30 a.m. and travel to Indianapolis. You will make a lunch stop at MCL Restaurant & Bakery for some good, down-home cooking. Then, continue to Dayton for a stop at the Carillon Historical Park. Visit the Wright Brothers National Museum and see the replica of Wilbur and Orville's bicycle shop. Later, continue to Columbus and check-in to your hotel. Tonight, enjoy the Manager's reception at the Drury Inn.

**(Lunch and Manager's Reception)**

**DAY 2 Johnstown Flood Site and Flight 93 Memorial:** Depart Columbus this morning and arrive in Johnstown, Pennsylvania. Here, you will visit the Johnstown National Memorial dedicated to the disastrous flood of 1889. Learn about the South Fork Dam break which devastated the area and cost thousands of lives. Continue to the Flight 93 National Memorial which was built to commemorate the crash of United Airlines Flight 93, which was one of four aircraft hijacked during the September 11 attacks in 2001. Later, arrive at your hotel. **(Breakfast and dinner)**

**DAY 3 Antietam Battlefield, Fort Ritchie and Gettysburg:** At the Antietam Battlefield a local guide explains the importance of the battle to the Maryland Campaign. Then, make a stop at Fort Ritchie, the one-time National Guard Training Camp and Military Intelligence Training Center. In Gettysburg, tour the Visitor Center followed by a narrated tour of the battlefield to learn the importance of The Peach Orchard and Little Round Top. Tonight, dinner is included before arriving at the hotel.

**(Breakfast and dinner)**

**DAY 4 Hershey and the National Civil War Museum:** Begin the day at The Hershey Story – The Museum on Chocolate Avenue. Experience the legacy of Milton S. Hershey as the museum takes you on a journey through his life, his chocolate company and his generous philanthropic history. You will also visit Hershey's Chocolate World, a multi-faceted experiential attraction with chocolate tour rides, tastings and more. Then learn the history of the "Battle Between the States" at the National Civil War Museum.



One of the largest museums in the world dedicated solely to the American Civil War, it presents the historic years-long war equally from both sides. **(Breakfast and Manager's Reception)**

**DAY 5 First Ladies National Historic Site and Rock and Roll Hall of Fame:** Travel to Canton this morning for a visit to the First Ladies National Historic Site, home to an extensive collection of stories, places, and artifacts representing all of the First Ladies of the United States - past and present. In Cleveland you will tour the one-of-kind Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. At the "Rock Hall" you can delve into the world of legendary artists, groundbreaking music and explore the cultural impact of Rock and Roll. **(Breakfast and dinner)**

**DAY 6 South Bend Chocolate Factory and Home:** Make your way across Ohio today to the South Bend Chocolate Factory. Stop for a sweet treat before arriving home. **(Breakfast)**
