### **NOTES/COMMENTS**

Following this Transfer Guide while completing an Associate in Science (A.S.) degree in Kinesiology at Waubonsee is highly recommended to complete the Bachelor of Science (B.S) degree in Kinesiology at NIU in a 2+2 model. Sixty (60) credit hours are required for the A.S. degree in Kinesiology. Students will complete an additional sixty six (60) credit hours at NIU for the B.S. degree in Kinesiology. Students should always work closely with the academic advising staff at both Waubonsee and NIU.

### **Northern Illinois University**

All students pursuing the B.S. degree with a major in kinesiology are required to have a university GPA of 2.50 or above and to have satisfactorily completed all required coursework prior to the culminating internship, KNPE 494.

### Additional transfer guide notes

The sequence of courses in this Transfer Guide is an example of what a 4-year plan may look like for a typical student based on the stated catalog year. It is recommended that students complete courses in this order due to course prerequisites (check the appropriate college catalog for more information about course pre-requisites). Developmental course requirements may alter this plan. Students are encouraged to explore summer school course offerings in order to complete their program requirements in a timely fashion or reduce the load during the fall and spring semesters. All students are encouraged to meet with an academic advisor each semester to discuss course scheduling.

#### Accreditation
